

ABUNDANT LIFE

In John's gospel, we read that as Jesus reflects on his life and ministry, he makes the comment that he has come "so that they might have life, and have it in abundance." As grand and dramatic as this statement sounds, I think that quite often the ways and places that we find and experience life abundantly is in the small and mundane parts of life...when we stop waiting for life to be miraculous, and start finding ways to make it or recognize it to be miraculous.

I recently read a beautiful prose poem that captures for me this idea of finding abundant life in the regular spaces of life. I hope you find it to be as touching as I did.

Gate A4 by Naomi Shihab Nye

Wandering around the Albuquerque Airport Terminal, after learning my flight had been detained four hours, I heard an announcement: "If anyone in the vicinity of Gate 4-A understands any Arabic, please come to the gate immediately." Well – one pauses these days. Gate 4-A was my own gate. I went there. An older woman in full traditional Palestinian embroidered dress, just like my grandma wore, was crumpled to the floor, wailing loudly. "Help," said the Flight Service Person. "Talk to her. What is her problem? We told her the flight was going to be late and she did this." I stooped to put my arm around the woman and spoke to her haltingly. "Shu dow-a, Shubid-uck Habibti? Stani schway, Min fadlick, Shu-bit-se-wee?" The minute she heard any words she knew, however poorly used, she stopped crying. She thought the flight had been cancelled entirely. She needed to be in El Paso for major medical treatment the next day. I said, "You're fine, you'll get there, who is picking you up? Let's call him." We called her son and I spoke with him in English. I told him I would stay with his mother till we got on the plane and would ride next to her.

She talked to him. Then we called her other sons just for fun. Then we called my dad and he and she spoke for a while in Arabic and found out they had ten shared friends. Then I thought just for the heck of it why not call some Palestinian poets I know and let them chat with her? This all took up about two hours. She was laughing a lot by then. Telling about her life, patting my knee, answering questions. She had pulled a sack of homemade mamool cookies – little powdered sugar crumbly mounds stuffed with dates and nuts – out of her bag – and was offering them to all the women at the gate. To my amazement, not a single woman declined one. It was like a sacrament. The traveler from Argentina, the mom from California, the lovely woman from Laredo – we were all covered with the same powdered sugar. And smiling. There is no better cookie. And then the airline broke out the free beverages from huge coolers and two little girls from our flight ran around serving us all apple juice and they were covered with powdered sugar too. And I noticed my new best friend – by now we were holding hands – had a potted plant poking out of her bag - some medicinal thing, with green furry leaves. Such an old country traveling tradition. Always carry a plant. Always stay rooted to somewhere. And I looked around that gate of late and weary ones and thought, this is the world I want to live in. The shared world. Not a single person in this gate – once the crying of confusion stopped – seemed apprehensive about any other person. They took the cookies. I wanted to hug all those other women too. This can still happen anywhere. Not everything is lost.

CONGREGATIONAL LIFE/COMMUNITY CARE

At the February 11 Council meeting, members spent time talking about the church organizational structure and how to improve it. As a one-year trial, Congregational Life and Community Care will merge, to try to even out the workload over the year. We are hoping to find more volunteers to help with summer events.

We also learned that the vote on whether to become an Open and Affirming church in the United Church of Christ was overwhelmingly positive. Church members voted by secret ballot to move forward in deepening and opening our understanding of LGBTQIA+ people and their families and offering loving welcome.

OPERATIONS GROUP

Meeting called to order at 7:00pm by Betsy. Attending: Hope, Eliot, Kelly, Brian, Betsy, and Matt. Opening prayer from Hope.

Betsy reports that the community giving campaign is nearing \$5K and will be coming to an end soon. The stewardship campaign will be once per year going forward and will be run by the ops committee.

The Service Credit Union ac-

count has been closed; this will result in less paperwork and accounting overall.

Betsy is moving forward on the internet options working with Fibercast. There are several ways to go; she is going to try to get us a residential account vs a small business which would be less expensive. Ryan has been helping Betsy with this project.

Our bookkeeping structure needs some work going forward. Eliot, Kelly, and Betsy will have a short meeting after this meeting to discuss those changes.

Kelly reports that the solar is online as of January 16, 2024. She will monitor bills going forward and keep the committee advised. Kelly also completed a very lengthy paperwork submission that may result in a rebate of approximately \$15K dollars. She has done all the legwork but needs someone to review it before submission to ensure that the details are correct. Matt believes he has someone who can do this for her.

Eliot reports that Ed Schillemat picked up all of the recyclable items from the shed. Many thanks to Ed for doing this; we need to be more proactive in letting him know when to pick up so we don't have such a large amount at once.

Organizational structure review: Everyone has the option to change the committee that they work on every year. Matt is resigning from the Operations Committee and moving to the new combined Community Care/Congregational Life Committee to work with them.
