

# 250 YEARS OF MINISTRY



Join in celebrating 250 years of ministry in Nelson! At the first town meeting, in 1772, the early settlers voted to build a meetinghouse to serve both town and church, and to secure a minister. Both things were accomplished in 1773, when the Rev. James Treadway held services in a small log meetinghouse. Though the Nelson church did not officially vote to incorporate until 1781, this year we joyfully celebrate 250 years since the first Christian church service was held in Nelson.

Our church historian Bert Wingerson researched this early history. Bert writes, "The first town meeting called in the name of his Majesty the King of England was held in 1772 in the house of Breed Bachelder. It was voted to build a meetinghouse and secure a minister as was essential to the establishment of a new settlement. Although records are scarce, they do show that the first minister in 1773 was the Reverend James Treadway. The meeting-house was to be 30 feet long and 25 feet wide, built on the lot that had been set aside. It was finished the following summer, in 1773. The small, crude, log building served the needs of both town and church for 15 years, until a larger number of settlers could meet the cost of building a larger meetinghouse."

On Dec. 2, we will gather at Nelson Church at 4 p.m. to decorate the church at our Hanging of the Greens event and then at 5 pm we will welcome friends from the community to join us and to recognize this auspicious occasion. Members of the Nelson Town Band will play Christmas music, birthday cake and cider will be served, and we will close the gathering with carols and the lighting of our Christmas tree for the season. We hope to see you there!

### SOCIAL JUSTICE APPLICATIONS

In 2019, the Nelson Congregational Church created the Garrett-Larsen Social Justice Fund, in honor of the 19-year ministry of Rev. Dawn Garrett-Larsen in the wider Nelson community. The fund is offered to individuals or nonprofits in the Monadnock region that demonstrate a passion for social and environmental justice, a plan to advance that cause, and a need for funding.

In 2022, grants were awarded to Project Home, a nonprofit that helps asylum seekers, both individuals and families, in the Monadnock region; Hundred Nights Shelter in Keene, to support the construction of its new facility; and Linda's Closet in Keene, which assists women in achieving career goals and responds to emergencies in the community.

Any individual or nonprofit group with a strong tie to the Monadnock region is invited to apply in writing. For 2023, a total of \$2250 will be awarded. Recipients will be notified within four weeks of the November 30, 2023, deadline.
